- A photo I.D. (i.e. Drivers License)
- If representing a company, present credentials establishing your exact relationship with the company (i.e. Employee I.D.)
- A letter of authorization from the property owner for the use of their property.

CHAPTER 10 BUSINESSES
ARTICLE III. SALES
DIVISION 3. SOLICITORS*

***State law references:** Home solicitation sales, MCL 445.111 et seq.; transient merchants, MCL 445.371 et seq.; charitable organizations and solicitations act, MCL 400.271 et seq.; public safety solicitation act, MCL 14.301 et seq.; veteran's license for peddlers, MCL 35.441 et seq.

Sec. 10-121. Definition.

For the purpose of this division, the term "solicitor" shall mean any individual, traveling either by foot, automobile, truck, or any other type of conveyance, from place to place or from street to street, taking or attempting to take orders for sales of goods, wares, and merchandise, books or magazines, personal property of any nature whatsoever for immediate or future delivery, or for services to be furnished or provided. Commercial salespersons, selling or attempting to sell only to business establishments, shall be exempt from this definition. The term "solicitor" shall include peddler, canvasser, and any other term commonly used to denote a sales individual.

Sec. 10-122. Charitable solicitation excluded.

The provisions of this division shall not apply to any solicitation where such solicitation is clearly for a charitable or nonprofit purpose.

Sec. 10-123. License required.

No person shall engage in the business of solicitor within the township without first obtaining a license therefore.

Sec. 10-124. License application.

Applications for licenses under this division shall be filed with the township clerk, upon forms provided for that purpose, and shall contain the following information:

- 1) The name, address, and telephone number of the applicant. When applicable, this information shall include the permanent and local address and telephone number.
- 2) A brief description of the nature of the business and the goods to be sold.
- 3) If employed, the name, address, and telephone number of the employer, together with credentials establishing the exact relationship.
- 4) The length of time for which the right to do business is desired.
- 5) The place where the goods are manufactured or produced, where such goods are located at the time said application is filed, and the proposed method of delivery.
- 6) Any other information as may be reasonably required by the clerk to determine the character and nature of this proposed solicitation.

Sec. 10-125. Duration.

A license to engage as in the business of solicitor within the limits of the township shall be issued for a period of no more than 30 days. The license may be renewed for 30-day intervals.
